LEGALLY REQUIRED PUBLIC HEARING

- CHAPTER 436 OF THE LAWS OF NEW YORK, 1997. REQUIRES THAT THE PUBLIC HEARING BE HELD NO LESS THAN 7 AND NO MORE THAN 14 DAYS PRIOR TO THE BUDGET VOTE
- REQUIRES THAT THE BUDGET BE PRESENTED IN THE 3 COMPONENT FORMAT.
 1. ADMINISTRATION
 2. PROGRAM
 3. CAPITAL

Contingent Budget Rules

First Vote - June 9th

- Budget is below mandated 2% Cap
- Budget passes with 50%+1 positive votes

Contingent Budget (If first vote fails)

- Same tax levy as 2019-20
- No equipment purchases except health and safety
- Charge for all facilities use
- No additional budget requests can be honored

NEW Voting Process

- **What is the official school budget vote date?** Tuesday, June 9th
- **How will voting take place?** At home – this year, everyone will vote by following the absentee ballot voting process. There is no in person voting this year due to COVID-19.
- **How will voters receive ballots?** Ballots will be mailed home week of May 26th to all registered voters.
- **When must ballots be returned?** Ballots must be returned by 5 p.m. on June 9 to be included in the official count.
- **What if my ballot isn't received by 5 p.m. on June 9?** Any ballot received after 5 p.m. on June 9, even if postmarked with a date of June 9, will not count.
- **What am I voting on?** The proposed school budget for 2020-21 as well as cast a ballot for the three open seats on the Board of Education.
